Potomac marble isn't a true marble, but a breccia that is stunning when polished. However, it took some faith that it could be used. When building the Capitol, Latrobe needed something that was visually appealing, but also abundant and easy to transport. This stone can be found in abundance in Montgomery County and Loudon County.

If you want to see where it was quarried, take the canal path from White's Ferry, about 2.2 miles. You can start to see the ridge grow at about 1 mile.

Volunteers Needed for Our Show

Hello GLMSMC members!

Wonderfully, we have had quite a few new members join this year and in honor of that, I wanted to give everyone a rundown of all of the different types of volunteer positions that we have available for our upcoming annual mineral show on March 21 & 22nd. We have two full floors of activities, exhibits and dealers that bring in approximately 2,000 guests every year! There are 145 individual volunteer slots that last for two hours apiece that need to be filled each and every year by our dedicated members!!! That is a lot of volunteers and we can use your help!

The largest need for volunteers is also one of our most popular events at our show. It is our Lapidary Shop set-up for the kids to be able to shape their very own cabochon (which is an oval shaped, domed stone that is smoothed and polished and can be used in a piece of jewelry if desired). We have kids that have come to our show literally year after year so they can make another cabochon. For the shop to run at peak efficiency, we need people to help sign-in the kids, along with 5 to 6 individual lapidary stations that each have to be served by volunteers. After that, we also need the cabochons to be removed after the shaping and polishing process which requires another 1-2 volunteers. That also doesn't include the three dedicated shop committee volunteers that devote their entire weekend, including Friday to help the shop run effectively and smoothly. The Lapidary Shop committee is run by Gary Leaman, Karen Lottes, and Reed Owens and we always appreciate all of their individual efforts! We always need a tremendous amount of volunteers for the individual lapidary stations. Even if you don't have any experience, we provide training on the machines ahead of time and it is exceptionally easy to learn and help the children.

We also have a large Kid's Zone and Mini Mine area that is run mostly by our Junior program members, the Future Rockhounds of America (FRA) group. There are many volunteer slots to fill here, such as distributing free minerals to children visiting the show, passing out show quizzes for children, and a variety of other similar tasks. This is the very first time that many kids have had their eyes opened to minerals and fossils and we want to provide them with a wonderful experience and a new found passion for our hobby. Maybe this is where you would like to help?

There are also many general show tasks that also need to be filled, such as the show set-up on Friday morning and also the teardown on Sunday afternoon/evening. Also, at the front desk we need volunteers for admissions, hospitality, raffle ticket sales, assistance for completion of door prize




