Hello Rockhounds,



Katie Seitz made a donation for a door prize specimen of a Tourmaline-Mica combination from Quebec to the club.


PRESENTATION: John Weidner gave a comprehensive presentation on garnets. Garnets actually comprise many different minerals, but they generally have the following qualities: they are dense, stand out from the matrix, can be any color, have roughly equal sides, no cleavage, and have a hardness of 6.5 to 7.5. The best known garnets are Spessartine, Almandine, Pyrope, Grossular, Andradite, and Uvarovite.


