It is also the beginning of many mineral shows coming up in the next few months.



There was a nice selection of fluorescent minerals from Franklin/Sterling Hill, along with worldwide minerals.

Sterling Hill also had a sale going on in their pavilion with a nice selection of traprock specimens from many of the New Jersey quarries in Patterson, such as a New Street, Lower New Street, and Prospect Park. Some wonderful specimens of prehnite, anhydrite, apopholite, and stilbite were to be had, along with some gorgeous specimens of cornelian, which is a type of quartz found in the Watachung mountains in New Jersey.

The main event was, of course, the Franklin/Sterling Fall Mineral Show! There are many dealers inside the warehouse building, selling worldwide minerals and jewelry. Inside, there were also fluorescent displays, along with our own Chris Luzier, who put up a fantastic fluorescent display of cabochons, which I have included some pictures of as well.
