June Speaker Information

Speaker: Chris Luzier

Title of Talk: "The Franklin & Sterling Hill Mines, New Jersey— There's a Reason They are World Famous!"

The presentation will focus on the fluorescent minerals of the district, but will also detail the multitude of other reasons why they have been famous for decades and will remain so.

Christopher Luzier has been a lifelong collector of minerals and fossils. He is active in the region's gem, mineral, and fossil societies. He has served on the Board of the Gem, Lapidary, and Mineral Society of Montgomery County, MD as President, Vice President, and has been the Downstairs Showchair for almost eight years. He has provided many exhibits and presentations for a variety of organizations and educational institutions. He specializes in fossils and minerals of the Maryland, Pennsylvania, and New Jersey areas, including the fluorescent minerals from the world-famous mines of the Franklin and Sterling Hill mineral district in

the Franklin, NJ region. He is a presenter on megalodon, shark teeth, and other fossil marine fauna of the Calvert Cliffs Miocene epoch. Mr. Luzier was also one of the founding members of the fossil group at the Natural History Society of Maryland.

His most recent published work was in the Spring 2023 issue of the classic publication, *The Picking Table Journal*, that has specialized in Franklin-Sterling Hill minerals since the 1960s. This article focused on a rare and forgotten mineral species, cuspidine, from Franklin, NJ. It was discovered in 1899, but then was lost to time for almost 100 years, as no new specimens were located. The original grains of cuspidine that were tested were discarded at the time, hence what Franklin cuspidine looked like was completely unknown.

The article detailed how cuspidine was discovered, rediscovered, and the exciting prospect that it can still be found today. Because of the scarcity of the material, Mr. Luzier requested submissions for photographs and history of individual specimens from other collectors and museums with known examples of cuspidine. This process took 4-1/2 years to complete with visits to collections, photography, and grouping of various cuspidine finds, stories and the people behind them. In the end, multiple collectors came forward, along with the Franklin Mineral Museum and the Smithsonian Institution as well. All provided specimens and much individual history that also tied back to the 1899 discovery at Franklin. The final publication includes seventy-eight beautiful photographs and is the most comprehensive study of cuspidine to date.



GLMSMC Regular Meeting from May 13, 2024

The meeting was called to order at 7:45 PM by Andy. The motion to accept the Regular Meeting minutes for March and both the Regular and Board Meeting minutes for April was seconded and passed.

Program: "Mineral-Security Nexus" from Thomas Hale

The talk was about minerals, their uses for future technology, and how the US is behind on these issues. Climate goals are pushing the discussion, but to be at net zero emissions by 2050, we would have to be mining more than six times what is currently produced. 54% of all new projects are on or near Indigenous communities or watersheds, making them ecologically tenuous.

Minerals are important for national security, human security, and energy security. If you can't grow it, you have to mine it. If the minerals aren't where you are, they have to be imported. But there is a lot of risk to the planet and to people. Environmental impact and political insecurity are all concerns.

The meeting adjourned at 9:39 PM.


