March Meeting Information

Speaker: Fred Paraskevoudakis

Title of Talk: New Images and Videos from The

Silver Mines of Lavrion, Greece

Abstract: This lecture will be a second part to January's lecture, and will cover other locations in the myriad of the mine tunnels not previously shown. Surface mining began as early as 3000 years ago in the ancient site of Thorikos adjacent to Lavrion. With more intensive mining, starting around 600 BC., the silver mines at Lavrion yielded an enormous wealth both monetarily and in diversity of mineral species. There will be a brief overview of the ancient sites where this all began mentioning the historical importance, and then focus on the modern day mines which began in 1865 and ran strong until 1976. Today, visitors to the small town of Lavrion can see two, small but wonderful, museums packed with incredible mineral collections, that also showcase some of the old mining history and equipment. The presentation will include numerous slides and videos from the most recent trips (2023- '24) inside the mine shafts, and reveal the stunning mineral wealth that still lies inside.

Lavrion is perhaps the richest site in the world, after Tsumeb, Namibia, with 672 (Mindat) cataloged mineral species and continues to be a scientific destination for Geologists and Mineralogists.

Biosketch: Fred Paraskevoudakis (Paras) is a professor at Baltimore City Community College where he has taught mostly Microbiology, some Biotechnology and Environmental Science, since 1992. His education includes two BS, two MS degrees (Environmental science, Molecular Bio) and PhD work in Science Education. His interests in Natural History stem from his childhood in the tropics where he collected butterflies and shells, hobbies which he continues today with his own large scientific collections. These interests have been pursued through extensive travels in many countries on all continents of the world. Fred is the president of the Maryland Entomological Society and longtime member of the Natural History Society of Md. where he is the curator of the shell collection. Although he had a rudimentary interest in fossils and minerals growing up, he became very active in these areas in the last 10 years.

GLMSMC Regular Meeting Minutes from February 10th, 2025

The meeting was called to order by President Chris Luzier at 7:45 pm. There were approximately 41 adults and 5 juniors in attendance, including lifetime member Holly Heighes. It was M/S/P to approve the minutes of the 13 January 2025 Regular meeting and of the 20 January 2025 Board of Directors Meeting.

Announcements: Chris Luzier welcomed everyone to the meeting. Chris discussed a new order of Andy Muir commemorative t-shirts, available in two new colors. He took orders so the shirts could be distributed at the March meeting in advance of the show.

Show: Chris provided an update on the upcoming show. Exhibit cases were still needed. Forms were available to fill out and would be distributed. Volunteer sign-up sheets were distributed. Many positions were filled, but the mini miners' section had openings. A cabochon demonstrator slot needed to be filled. Advertising and promotion online are needed from members. Joel Rosen thanked those who had signed up for set-up and take-down. He emphasized we could use more volunteers. The food vendor has been coordinated. Those members setting up display cases must have their cases set-up by 6:00 PM. At that point the downstairs will be closed to allow members to get a good sleep before the show. It is a good practice to organize the display at home in advance in order to speed set-up at the show.

Membership: Membership chair Doug Baum thanked those who had already paid their dues. He invited those who were unsure to stop by and check. It was M/S/P to accept the membership applications of Charlie (a past club president), Stephen, Fred, and Adrian.

Treasurer: Jonathan Harris reported that the state and federal tax forms had been filed. The insurance has been paid.

Program: Chris introduced our speaker for the evening, James Hall. James has a long association with the club, including a display award in 1977. The presentation was entitled "Collecting at the Reel Mine, Iron Station, NC." James began with the story of a collecting trip spurred on by the news of the imminent sale of the Reel Mine. As the collecting passed week to week the sale never occurred. Eventually his enthusiasm caught the attention of the owner, who was now without a buyer. A quick, unexpected, negotiation resulted in an agreement neither could refuse. Since that time James has worked the mine thoughtfully and carefully by hand. Trips to Tucson sparked interest and visits by museum scientists to study the deposit. He described the geology of the mine and the signs that can be read to search for the pockets containing the amethyst crystals the mine is known for. He gave a specific example of an 8ft long pocket that held at its lower end a spectacular specimen on matrix. The specimen was carefully removed and now graces the lobby of a museum in Arizona.


