May Meeting Information

Speaker: Steve Hatleberg **Title of Talk:** Copper Rocks of South Mountain

The May meeting speaker will be our own, Steve Hatleberg with a presentation on the "Copper Rocks of South Mountain" for the next GLMSMC meeting on May 12th, 2025. Native copper and its association with Catoctin Greenstone, a metamorphic basalt, will be discussed. Steve will talk about the geologic processes that brought these rocks to the South Mountain in Maryland and Pennsylvania. This will include a brief discussion of plate tectonics, hydrothermal mineral deposition, erosion, and geologic time. The history of copper mining in South Mountain will also be reviewed, starting with the colonial era up through the present. Lastly, he will show what six of the old mine sites look like today. Steve will also be bringing examples of native copper for display. He brought a very large example of native copper to our last meeting, which was also from this same area that he will be discussing for our May meeting.

The 14 April 2025 meeting was called to order by President Chris Luzier at 7:41 pm. There were approximately 53 adults and 8 juniors in attendance. Announcements: President Chris Luzier welcomed everyone to the meeting. He had some lost & found items from the meeting. If you left something behind setting up a case, contact Chris. Upcoming shows were announced, including the availability of passes to one of them from a member dealer. Chris announced an auction of donated material, including a large blue coral and fluorescent calcite casts in shell fossils from Ruck's Pit. Field Trips: There is an upcoming field trip to a WV quarry. It will not occur if raining due to potential for deep mud.

Membership: Membership chair Doug Baum invited guests to introduce themselves. It was M/S/P to accept the membership applications of multiple families and new individual members as well.

Treasurer: Jonathan Harris reported the club is solvent. The show attendance has increased but is not at pre-COVID levels.

Program: Vice-President Heather Vineyard introduced our speaker for the evening, member Jeff Nagy. The presentation was titled "Historic Gold and Copper Mines of Maryland." Although the presence of gold in Maryland was anticipated to exist much earlier, interest in gold mining began with the discovery of gold in Maryland in 1849 on the property of Samual Ellicott near Sandy Spring. In 1861 gold is discovered on the property of Dick Collins. The history of mining here is traced through eventually becoming the Maryland Mine. Much history comes through the Ingalls Collection, from the family of a one-time worker and later foreman Edgar Ingalls. The history of gold and copper mining is presented with historical records and contemporary photographs of several mine locations. Jeff displayed several specimens of copper mineralization retrieved from former mine locations or former miners' collections. Thanks, Jeff.

Diane Leaman administered the auction of donated material.

The show table and door prizes were administered by Joel Rosen.

President: Chris reported that the editor email will be updated and tested soon. Chris exhibited at the show at the Howard County Fairgrounds.

Membership: Several new members have joined. Details of listing in minutes were discussed. The secretary will provide the text of the motion to grant membership.
